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VA LAUNCHES \$4 MILLION GRANT PROGRAM TO SUPPORT VETERAN AND SPOUSE EMPLOYMENT

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has introduced a new \$4 million grant initiative aimed at helping veterans and their spouses transition successfully into employment. Announced on Military Spouse Appreciation Day, this program stems from legislation passed by Congress in 2021 and will provide grants of up to \$500,000 to organizations dedicated to offering employment-based resources for transitioning service members and their spouses.

The grants are designed to fund services such as resume writing assistance, interview preparation, employment placement services, and other career support tools essential for post-military success.

"These grants will help our nation's service members and their spouses access the resources they need to secure the jobs they deserve," said the VA Under Secretary for Benefits. "Our goal is to empower transitioning service members and their families, ensuring their move into civilian life is not only manageable but sets them up for long-term success."



Currently, separating troops and their spouses have access to Military OneSource services through the Department of Defense for one year after leaving the military. Additionally, the Department of Labor offers Transition Employment Assistance workshops tailored for military spouses and caregivers. Despite these resources, the unemployment rate among military and veteran spouses remains above 20%.

The new VA grant program seeks to close this gap by providing targeted funding to organizations that can deliver impactful employment support. Further details on how to apply for these grants will be released in June 2025.

Veteran employment rates have generally remained stable, aligning with national trends. However, younger veterans often face challenges in securing employment during their initial years post-service.

This initiative reflects a broader commitment by federal lawmakers to address employment challenges among veterans and military families. Provisions to support this group are also being considered in the upcoming defense authorization bill.

Organizations interested in applying for the VA grants should monitor upcoming announcements for application procedures and deadlines.

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WASHINGTON D.C.'S PATH FOR VETERAN BUSINESS OWNERS

The recent Small Business Conference in Washington, D.C. showcased how veteran entrepreneurs are being empowered transform their business futures. VIP National Director Barbara Ashe emphasized that mastering federal contracts not only opens doors to lucrative government opportunities but also provides valuable experience applicable to local, state, and private sector markets.

Throughout the conference, veterans shared personal stories of overcoming challenges such as gender bias, limited access to capital, and the complexities of niche markets during times of economic uncertainty.

These accounts underscored the resilience and collaborative spirit of the veteran community, highlighting the importance of mutual support, continuous learning, and strong relationship-building to drive sustainable business success.

Government officials further introduced initiatives like a unified certification platform that streamlines access to multiple certifications portal, through а single simplifying veteran the process for entrepreneurs. Overall, the event served as a powerful launchpad that reaffirmed when veterans leverage their unique skills, commit to ongoing education, and rely on a robust support network, they are exceptionally wellpositioned to seize new opportunities, build lasting business relationships, and create generational success in an ever-evolving marketplace.
